Every night, 1000 women and their children are turned away from homeless shelters across Canada

A lack of funding for gender-specific homeless support services exacerbates vulnerabilities for women and gender-diverse people.



Only 13% of shelter beds are dedicated to women



Support services overlook women experiencing hidden homelessness

Women and gender-diverse people who live with an abuser are not prioritized for homeless support services because they are not viewed as chronically homeless.

The most common cause for homelessness amongst women is a break-up

Indigenous People displaced on Indigneous land



Indigenous Peoples are the original peoples of the land, but are disproportionately represented amongst those experiencing homelessness.

Indigenous homelessness is linked to colonial violence

Settlers refused to acknowledge the basic humanity of Indigenous Peoples specifically to take their land.
Once land was seized, assimilation approaches like the Residential School system were used to erase the culture and language of Indigenous

groups



The dispossession of land from Indigenous Peoples is connected to the disproportionate rate of homelessness amongst Indigenous populations.
